***“Portuguese for English Speakers and Heritage Learners: Literacy,
Identity, and Citizenship through Cultural Practices”***

This workshop will be based on the philosophy developed by “The Picker Paper Press” (www.culturalagents.org). Participants will learn how to approach literary texts as recycled material available for endlessly creative recycling. Using canonical and non-canonical texts both in English and in Portuguese, they will perform variants, paint visions or moods inspired by stories, and set them to music or dance. Subsequently, they will learn how the re-writing of stories from a new point of view, from different times and places, and in various genres entitles students to become authors, as they master the technical and conceptual materials they play with.
