FELLOWSHIPS • GRANTS • AWARDS for Harvard Graduate Students

- **HARVARD POSTDOCTORAL FELLOWSHIPS IN JAPANESE STUDIES for 2010-11**

Supports recent PhDs of exceptional promise while they revise their dissertations for publication. Applicants must have received the PhD degree in 2005 or later, in Japanese studies in any area of the humanities or social sciences. Those who are chosen to receive fellowships must have completed all requirements for the PhD degree by July 1, 2010. Residence in Cambridge/Boston area, teaching one undergraduate course during the fall or spring semester of the academic year, and participation in Institute activities are required.
Deadline: must be received by JANUARY 4, 2010 (Mon.)
- **SUPPLEMENTARY/COMPLETION DISSERTATION GRANTS for 2010-11,**

Provides limited support to Harvard doctoral candidates in the dissertation **RESEARCH** or **COMPLETION** stage in any field of Japanese studies in the humanities or social sciences. (Grants up to \$20,000. Students may receive a grant in each of these two categories only once.)
Deadline: FEBRUARY 19, 2010 (Fri.)
- **REISCHAUER INSTITUTE SUMMER RESEARCH GRANTS FOR GRADUATE STUDENTS**

Supports Harvard graduate students in the humanities or social sciences whose work is focused on Japan. In addition to doctoral candidates, continuing students in Harvard Masters programs will be considered, as will graduating Harvard Masters students who will enter a Harvard PhD program in the following year. Awards are normally for summer research travel from Harvard to Japan, and return. (Grants up to \$4,000.)
Deadline: FEBRUARY 12, 2010 (Fri.)
- **REISCHAUER INSTITUTE SUMMER LANGUAGE STUDY GRANTS FOR DOCTORAL STUDENTS**

Supports PhD candidates in the humanities or social sciences for language study, directly related to a doctoral dissertation in Japanese studies, which cannot be conveniently pursued during the academic year. (Grants up to \$5,000.) **Deadline: FEBRUARY 12, 2010 (Fri.)**
- **GRADUATE SUMMER LANGUAGE GRANTS FOR EAST, SOUTH AND SOUTHEAST ASIAN LANGUAGE STUDY** (Harvard University Asia Center, the Fairbank Center for Chinese Studies, the Korea Institute, and the Edwin O. Reischauer Institute of Japanese Studies)

These grants are for students enrolled in a master's or doctoral program at Harvard in the Faculty of Arts and Sciences or any of its professional schools for study during the summer of an East Asian language (including Altaic languages) or of one of the languages of South or Southeast Asia. Study should take place at accredited programs outside of the U.S., but exceptions may be made when this is not possible. (Grants will normally not exceed \$6,000.) **Deadline: FEBRUARY 12, 2010 (Fri.)**
- **DISSERTATION PRODUCTION GRANTS**

To help cover word-processing, binding, or other costs for the final draft of the dissertation are available to qualified Harvard doctoral candidates in the field of Japanese studies. (Maximum grant: \$500.)
Deadlines: OCTOBER 1 for November degree; **JANUARY 15** for March degree; **MAY 14** for May degree.
- **CONFERENCE ATTENDANCE GRANTS**

For Harvard graduate students in the field of Japanese studies in the humanities or social sciences to help defray cost of travel, registration fees and other expenses incurred during attendance at scholarly conferences where they present papers or serve as panel discussants. (Maximum grant: \$800.)
Application must be made at least one month in advance of the conference.
- **NOMA-REISCHAUER PRIZES IN JAPANESE STUDIES**

Awarded to Harvard students who write essays on Japan-related topics. One (\$2,000) undergraduate prize and one (\$3,000) graduate student prize are awarded annually.
Deadline: JUNE 21, 2010 (Mon.). Submission due in CGIS South, Room S234, 1730 Cambridge St.
- **RI STUDENT ORGANIZATION GRANTS**

Awarded to Harvard student groups to support activities that focus on or include Japan. Grants are offered on an ongoing basis; however, organizations are encouraged to apply as early as possible as funds are limited. Groups seeking support must submit the "Common Application for Student Organization Grants" posted at <http://www.fas.harvard.edu/~rijs/fellowships>. (This form is used by the Asia Center, Fairbank Center, Korea Institute, Reischauer Institute, and South Asia Initiative.)
